## Board Meeting Notes

### Approvals:

#### Board Approves Repairs to Village Hall

By unanimous vote the Board approved a bid from Quest Termite to make several repairs to both the interior and exterior of the Village Hall and to fumigate the entire building for termites. The repairs include replacement of siding, trim and fascia as well as some structural members and correcting earth to wood contact. Repairs and fumigation will be funded from Reserves in the amount of \$16231.00. This action also rescinds the approval last month, of \$2400.00 for repairs to the Village Hall floor at the south entrance.

#### 2005 Budget Error Corrected

The Board took action to correct an error in the 2005 budget. In the original budget Meter Reading and Billing was shown as a separate item as well as being included in Residential Water.

After much discussion the Board opted to reallocate the extra \$2.52 per month per unit in the following manner:

\$1.50 per unit per month will be added to the Common Area Water budget. The remaining \$1.02 per unit per month will be allocated to Reserves. A new budget is attached to this newspaper. Assessments will be \$153.00 beginning with the January 2005 bill.

## Office Notes

**Assessments:** Starting Jan. 1, 2005 the assessments will be \$153.00 per month and will be reflected on your bill.

Effective this month there will no longer be a \$0.30 charge for the Auto Pay Plan. Remember not to deduct the 30 cent charge from your check book.
