## **Getting to know...Jerry Marecek**

Jerry eagerly admits to being born 87 years ago in Chicago. Actually, it was a suburb, he says, called Cicero. He lived on the same street as Al Capone, and saw him occasionally. Now we know why Jerry isn't very chatty. He probably didn't want to be accused of "talking".

His first job as a young man, was in a grocery store as a stock boy. He stayed with the business, and became a manager. The store was part of a chain of stores called "Dominic's", which was owned by an Eastern Mafia group. He stayed with them until he retired at 62. His wife, Stella, also retired at the same time. She was the manager in the dress department of Webolt's Department Store, and that's where Jerry met her. Not in the dress department, but in the "eating place", according to Jerry.

Stella had always wanted to come to California, so out they came to put a deposit on a place in Santa Monica. While they were there, they decided to become adventurous and go all the way down to T. J. (Tijuana). On the way back they passed by Lawrence Welk's place and stopped to have lunch. They looked around and liked what they saw. When they asked what was for sale, they were directed to #166. It was all set up, so they went back home to Chicago to get rid of all their "doings". They moved in about 1978.

Jerry attended St. Constantine and Helen, the Greek Orthodox Church in Leucadia with Stella, who was

Greek. Every year they worked many hours serving food at the annual fairs. As you can imagine, Stella with her dress department background was an elegant dresser. Jerry says he was always very proud of her. Sadly, in 1995, Stella passed away. Her sister and brother-in-law still live in Rancho Bernardo.

Jerry got involved in the "Men's Breakfast" soon after they came to the Village. At that time they were held in the old clubhouse down below. (For the newer residents, the old club house is now the Welk "Timeshares" building.) The original price was 75¢ and they served 200, even in those early days.

Charlie Bibleheimer was head of the breakfast group and, as he needed an operation, he asked Jerry to take his place. When he returned, he said he wasn't able to handle it, so would Jerry take over.

Jerry has the distinction of being the last "charter member" for free golf, which he has greatly enjoyed. He also was given a lifetime membership two years ago from the C. V. Men's Golf Club for his dependability providing refreshments for their functions.

Currently, he does the set-up for the blood pressure checking that takes place the first Friday of every month in the clubhouse. He prepares the coffee as well as getting the area ready for the 45-plus people that take advantage of this great service.

Jerry has had a long interest in healthful foods, and has done extensive reading on the health aspects of food. He likes going to Henry's for their produce. If he could give just one piece of advice, he would say, "Eat your asparagus." He comments that it is a pretty expensive vegetable but a very good one. When asked what his favorite department in the market was, he said, "Dairy." ---Got milk?
