NOTES FROM THE BOARD By Wade Steverson

Board of Directors Open Board Meeting
January 18, 2018

1. A motion approved for acceptance of the Open Board Meeting.
2. Minutes of both the November 16, 2017 Board Meeting and the December 18, 2017 Special Meeting were approved.
3. The Financial Statements and Bank Reconciliations for the periods ending November 30, 2017 and December 31, 2017 were approved, pending the independent year-end Financial Review.
4. President John Grubb announced the Board resignations of Directors Hil Sybesma and Sue Seebach. The Board voted to accept their resignations.

NEW BUSINESS ITEMS:

1. The Board approved to count the ballots for the proposed changes to the CC&Rs and Bylaws. These changes were approved by the vote of the Association, with more than 60% of the 347 ballots voting affirmatively.
2. The Board approved the SAC Operating Guidelines to be reviewed by the Governing Documents Committee.

3. The Board approved a proposal from Superior Gate to install a Lift Master Glide Gate Operator CSL24V, including battery backup, for the north gate, at a cost of \$3,450 to be charged to the Access Gate Reserve.
4. The Board approved a lien to be filed on a unit owned by the Department of Housing and Urban Development.
5. The Board confirmed six reserve expenditures.
6. The Board approved the 2018 Insurance Proposal in the amount of \$25,521.28, to be paid from reserves and reimbursed in twelve installments of \$2,126.77.
7. The recommendation of the Common Area Facilities Committee for additional storage space for the Boomer's Club was approved with the following amended motion: **that occupancy and management of this space and all spaces now and in the future that are located within the Village Hall would be the responsibility of the Property Manager.**

The next scheduled Director's Meeting is scheduled for February 15, 2018 at 6 pm in the Village Hall.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Passage this past week of the amendments to our governing documents was no small feat. Work began around fifteen months ago, when the Governing Documents Committee was tasked with modifying the CC&Rs and Bylaws and bringing them up to date. After four months of solid work by them, the Communications Committee took over, presenting a series of informational sessions to help members understand the changes. This committee also made it their job to phone each member who'd not yet voted, visit about 100 residents to ask for votes, and drop off or pick up ballots when needed. In all, 350 members cast their ballot and the changes passed by a comfortable margin. Had they not, additional expense and time would have been needed to petition the courts to request passage.

We all owe our thanks to those involved in this effort, from inception to completion: The Governing Docs Committee (Wade Steverson, Jean Slaughter, Bob Suttie and Susie Riley) and the Communications Committee (Sue Seebach, Janet LeRossignol and Susie Riley, along with volunteers Anna Mercereau and Pat Martin). To each and every one of you, I send my own sincerest thanks. WELL DONE!

JANUARY 22 BOARD ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING

During the organizational meeting held by the Board of Directors on January 22nd, Roger Elyea was unanimously appointed to the Board, replacing Sue Seebach who resigned on January 18th. Also unanimously appointed to the Board was Bob Suttie, who replaces Hil Sybesma (also recently resigned from the Board). Bob also replaces Sue Seebach as CFO, while Susan Robinson replaces Sue Seebach as Secretary (both these Officers were appointed unanimously).

OUR NEW GOVERNING DOCS HAVE PASSED!

During the January Board meeting, ballots were counted to determine whether the proposed modifications to our governing documents were approved. The results were **296** in favor of the modifications, with **51** not in favor. The number of votes required to pass the modifications was **275**, and we beat that number by **26**.

Over the coming weeks, these new documents will be executed by the President and Secretary of the Board, who will certify and declare, under penalty of perjury, that the requisite number of members have voted to approve the amendments. Once that has been accomplished, the new CC&Rs will be recorded and filed in Sacramento. As the new Bylaws do not require filing, they will simply be adopted.

You'll soon see these new Governing documents on the CVPOA website, ChampagneVillage.org. **Well done, Villagers, in passing these important changes!**

BOARD APPLICATIONS

This year, three Directors will be elected to the Board of Directors. If you've decided to run for one of these seats, your application to be placed on the ballot will be accepted up until close of business (**4:00 pm**) on **Friday, March 30, 2018**. You can pick up an application at the Office.

CONSIDERING A RUN FOR THE BOARD?

Board membership can be rewarding, but it's not for everyone. Before you jump in headfirst and throw your name into the hat, here are a few things to consider before running for the Board:

- The best Board members run because they're interested in supporting the overall success of the community, not just a single issue.
- While Board members do hear from happy Association members, they are more likely to deal with unhappy ones – so your ability to thoughtfully respond (and not react) will be important.
- Because your role on the Board is to consider all sides of an issue to make decisions that benefit the entire community, you need to keep an open mind, even when someone disagrees with you.
- Being on the Board is about teamwork. Individuals must respectfully work together even when they do not agree.
- While the Board typically meets a few times each month, a good deal of discussion and decision-making goes into the effort. You need to be willing to put in the time needed beyond these meetings.
- All Board members must agree to, abide by and sign the Ethics Policy. If you're not comfortable abiding by this policy, it's best not to run.

- Read your governing documents! A good sense of familiarity with the CC&Rs, Bylaws, and Rules and Regulations is important, especially when you're considering a run.

Even if you've served on other types of Boards, being on an HOA board is an entirely different effort. Because of this, it's best to talk with current and former Board members about what to expect. Their input can give you a clearer perspective of how you can contribute, as well as whether you want to run.

Serving on the Board can be a rewarding process that enables you to make a tangible impact on this community. If you're up for the job, be sure to submit your application (you can get one from the Office) before Friday, March 30th.

If being on the Board doesn't feel like the right fit, there are lots of other ways to get involved and contribute! Talk with the Office to learn more about how you can participate here in Champagne Village!

What are the Qualifications for being a Board Member?

The following is required to be qualified as a candidate for the Board:

- You must be an Association member (homeowner) in good standing (fully paid up in your monthly CVPOA fees).
- You must have been a full-time resident of Champagne Village for at least six months in each of the past two years.
- If you've previously served on the Board for more than one term, at least 11 months must have elapsed since your last term (each term is two years).
- At least 11 months must have elapsed since any co-owner of your residence has served as a Director.

If you'd like to run for the Board, be sure to pick up an application in the Office. All applications must be submitted no later than Friday, March 30th.

DID YOU KNOW...

What's a Standing Committee?

Unlike *ad hoc* committees that perform a single task (such as the current Well Committee) and then cease to exist, *standing* committees have an ongoing existence because their assigned task continues over time. Examples of standing committees are the Common Area Facilities and Social Activities Committees.

Want to know more? *Mandatory* committees are those that exist because they are established by our governing documents. While standing committees may be abolished by the Board, a mandatory committee can never be abolished unless the governing documents are amended. The only mandatory committee here at Champagne Village is the Architecture and Landscape (A&L) Committee.

What's a Conflict of Interest?

Directors on our Board owe a duty of loyalty to our Association, meaning they must act in the CVPOA's best interest. Doing so requires identifying and making known to the Board any conflicts of interest. But what, exactly, is a conflict of interest?

Conflicts of interest occur when any Board member's decisions are influenced by his/her personal interests rather than the interests of the Association, which can lead to breaches of their *fiduciary duties*. To be clear, a *fiduciary duty* is one where someone is entrusted with the care of money or property.

For example, if a Board member votes to award a roofing contract to a company owned by their spouse or other relative, the award of the contract results in a personal benefit to the Director. Directors must always, by law, fully disclose the conflict and ideally recuse themselves from any discussion and vote.





With record flu deaths reported in San Diego county, it's important to remember that we're only in the middle of flu season. If you haven't yet been vaccinated, please consider it.


HOME SWEET HOME!

HEALTH INSURANCE NEWS

February 15th wraps up the end of a disenrollment period for Medicare Advantage plans. If you've been considering changing back to Original Medicare, you are free to do it up until the 14th. With your disenrollment you are also given a special enrollment period to enroll in a drug plan which will begin the first of the following month after the plan receives your application. You can also enroll in a Supplemental or Medigap plan if you qualify.

Occasionally I meet an individual who does not realize that they have to apply for Medicare when they turn 65. Any time during the three months before one's 65th birthday, you can apply for your Medicare card. Online at socialsecurity.gov it only takes a few minutes to apply. Click on the sign up for Medicare on the right side of the screen. If you don't have online access, you can also go to your local Social Security office. You will automatically qualify for part A (no cost) if you have been working ten years or more, but you will need to sign up for part B which has a monthly premium. You'll be billed for the premium until you start receiving Social Security payments, then it can be deducted from your monthly check. You cannot enroll in an Advantage HMO or Medigap plan until you have part B enrollment. You can, however, just have Part A (hospitalization) and a Drug plan if you wish without Part B (medical). There is a penalty for signing up for part B medical or part D-drugs in years after you first qualify.

For those under 65, individual health care enrollment ended January 31st. Unless you have a special circumstance you cannot enroll in a health plan until November. Special circumstances would include losing your employer or spouse's plan, current plan is dropped by your carrier, you've moved to a new service area, or you've just become a citizen or legal resident. New babies can also be enrolled.

Dental and Specialty health policies can be purchased year round with no special enrollment periods. When in doubt call your local insurance agent for clarification of your options. Staying on top of your health care needs can save you stress and dollars.
