Board Meeting Notes

The Board voted to approve the implementation of the Tree Maintenance Plan for section #1 at a cost of \$6,300. \$2,520 will be charged to Tree Trimming and \$3,780 will be charged to Tree Removal.

By a majority vote the Board approved the installation of two Fujitsu Heat Pumps and Air Handlers (One for the Card Room and one for the Billiard Room) and one Fujitsu Heat Pump and Air Handler (for the Office) at a cost not to exceed \$13,000. This expense will be charged to the Village Hall Reserves. This equipment 80 times more efficient than our current 24 year old equipment and will allow independent control of temperature in all four rooms.

The Board approved the removal and replacement of 1600 square feet of damaged and/or unsafe concrete throughout the Community,

at a cost not to exceed \$16,352. This expense will be charged to Asphalt and Paving Reserves.

The date for Candidate's Day was set for May 5, 2008 at 6:00 PM in the Village Hall.

If you are interested in being on the Energy Committee please call me (749-1314). We are trying to think of ways to save energy and money. If you have high energy bills could you write down the KW on your bills over the last 12 months and call me; I would like to find out if there is any way you could save money. I am sure some homes have a bad heat pump as I did. I saved over \$700 in 12 months since I got my new heat pump.

Below are some ideas on how you may save some money.

Synergy Companies under contract to San Diego Gas & Electric (SDG&E) is offering to help make your mobile home more energy efficient at **ZERO COST** to you. You can receive the following **FREE**: *Compact fluorescent light bulbs, fluorescent light fixtures, Air conditioning tune-up, Low flow shower heads, faucet aerators and much more*, see the bulletin board in the copy room or near the office for more info.

MEDICAL BASELINE ALLOWANCE:

SDG&E offers people with special health needs a medical baseline allowance which can help keep energy costs down. All you need is a medical baseline application signed by your doctor. You may qualify if you have a **“condition for which additional heating or cooling is medically necessary to sustain the person’s life or prevent deterioration of the person’s medical condition.”**

This is a pretty broad statement and it may cover a host of conditions including old age. If you think it is important to your health to have air conditioning ask your doctor to sign the form. Available in the office or call me, Joe Klopp (749-1314).
