

BOARD NOTES

Thanks to all who attended the March CVPOA Board meeting. We value your attendance and input. The Board developed the CVPOA website to highlight Champagne Village and is to be used as a medium for your input to the board. Should you have any questions, requests and/or opinions go to cvpoa.com, then scroll down to and select message board, log in with your password and select general, and input your message. If you prefer you can also put your messages in writing, address it to the board and turn it in to the Office.

1. AAM did not have the financials ready for the board meeting so the CFO report was not complete.
2. Installation in the CVPOA park of three Aluma Wood patio covers, approximately 2036 square feet, and 14 recessed lights for \$33,075 was approved.
3. An increase from a twelve year price margin of \$0.20 to \$0.25 per gallon of propane gas was approved.
4. Evaluation of 26 California Live Oak Trees by Sima Tree Consulting for health and safety in an amount not to exceed \$2,000 thereby saving CV approximately \$3,500 from a previous bid was approved.
5. Investment of maturing CD and excess money market funds by Morgan Stanley was approved.
6. The request of Wayne and Charlotte Steele to override the A&L Committee's objection to furniture on their front porch was approved since the furniture is marketed as indoor/outdoor furniture.
7. Language of Common Area Tree Removal Policy was approved.
8. A \$1,692 expenditure for the replacement of a 300' Bond Cable to the rectifier near #197 was approved.
9. Future Board meetings to be scheduled at 6:00 pm on the fourth Wednesday of each month with the agenda meeting on the previous Friday was approved.

Board President John Grubb announced the selection of the Prescott Companies as the CVPOA management company. Prescott is an established firm with over 20 years of experience throughout the West Coast. The President of Prescott is Gloria Todisco, CCAM, CMCA, AMS, PCAM. After the normal business meeting an open forum was held for residents to express their opinions, questions and concerns about the new management.

3. At the "To hear your group's latest message, press 1" prompt, you press 1.
4. At the prompt: To listen to the most recent message press 1. To listen to an older message press 2." Press either "1" or "2".


CV CLUBS NEW CRITERIA FOR SUPPLIES

SOCIAL ACTIVITY COMMITTEE INVENTORY

The Chairman of the Social Activities Committee (SAC) is responsible for the materials, implements and supplies, used for social activities, stored in the locked areas of the Village Hall. *The Chairman of SAC may issue keys for these areas to individuals requiring access in order for them to perform their function in support of SAC activities.* However, the Chairman shall ensure that records are maintained reflecting the names of individuals receiving keys, descriptions of keys issued and date of return.

The Chairman of SAC, or such persons as designated by the Chairman, shall assume full responsibility for the maintenance of supplies to be used by the various groups in Champagne Village, including the performance of an annual physical inventory. These supplies shall be purchased by SAC from the funds made available by the CVPOA. The SAC Chairman shall be responsible for the maintenance and accountability of all inventories.

Village organizations and individuals may utilize the SAC equipment and supplies for events approved by the SAC Chairman in whatever format the Chairman specifies.






#393 Richard Wilkinson - (218) 791-6940

HEALTH INSURANCE NEWS

Because of the continual change in health insurance products, it is wise to be aware of new products available to be informed of all your options. One such product I mentioned briefly last year is critical illness insurance.

One might be surprised to learn that this form of insurance was not developed by an insurance agent or company, but by Dr. Marius Barnard, the son of the famous heart surgeon Christian Barnard of South Africa. He saw the need in that patients could survive the medical treatment but were often financially devastated or restricted by the financial costs.

Critical illness insurance is fairly new in California. It refers to insurance that pays when one is diagnosed with cancer, heart failure, or stroke. The money can be spent any way the client needs like income, specialty drugs, medical bills or other debts. It's a lump sum policy amount which can pay out more than once. If you have a heart attack and then have a stroke a few years later, it could pay out twice. This, of course, depends on the policy contract.

If you have a high deductible health insurance policy, it can be used to pay all the deductible, copays, drugs, or for unauthorized treatments like experimental and homeopathic options. It helps take away the limitations of traditional health coverage.

There is however, underwriting. You cannot have a recent history of heart, stroke or cancer before applying. Underwriting varies with the company you are considering. This type of health insurance is affordable and available through several established companies. Keep critical illness insurance in mind when considering your health care planning.

National Reconciliation Day is celebrated on



April 2 annually - a day intended to reestablish broken relationships. One continuing national effort in particular is taking place in Rwanda as the country continues to heal after a brutal genocide of the Hutu against the Tutsi. There are many stories of reconciliation between Hutu and Tutsi - one story at a time - of asking and granting forgiveness. Listen to a few: Mudaheranwa the Hutu states, "I burned her house. I tried to kill her and her children but they escaped. When I was released from jail, if I saw her, I would run and hide. But I decided to ask her for forgiveness. Mukanyandwi the Tutsi responds, "I used to hate him but when he begged for forgiveness, I was moved by his sincerity. Now when I face any issue, I call him." And here's another story: Dominique relates, "The day I thought of asking pardon, I felt relieved. I had lost my humanity because of the crime I committed." Munganyinka responds, "After I was chased from my village and Dominique and others looted it, I became homeless and insane. Later, when he asked my pardon, I said: 'My children have no house!' The next week, Dominique came with some survivors and former perpetrators of the genocide and they built my family a house. Now I feel peaceful in my heart, and I share this peace with my neighbors." What stories to contemplate during National Reconciliation Day!
