Remembering... Gladys Wilkinson

On March 7th, the Village lost the travel agent who had been providing that service to many residents for years. Gladys had not been well, but said that she felt fine, and then slipped away on her final trip. Gladys started life as a bright red-haired baby August 4, 1919, on a farm in Iowa. Why doesn’t the hair color surprise us? But it might be a surprise to some to find out that she was a real tomboy. She would ride her horse, taking the cows to and from the pasture. She would ride along with her dad, when he was buying and selling seed to the farmers, until her younger brother was old enough to take over.

After graduation from eighth grade at their local school, she attended high school in Farmington, Iowa, which was too far for commuting. She and her sister roomed with a nice little lady. They would bring their supplies each week from home. Their father would check in on them at least once or twice a week. Gladys made the first team in basketball her first year in high school, and the following year made the All-State Basketball team.

She married Manlius Judd in May of 1935. They became farmers, and so Gladys shucked corn, plowed with a tractor, cultivated corn and milked cows night and morning, along with her husband. In the winter-time, after their chores were done, they played pinochle, 500 rummy and many other card games. Could this explain why she was such an avid bridge player?

In October of 1952 she moved to Long Beach, California, with her two daughters, Rosetta and Alicia . Her marriage had ended in divorce. In Long

Beach, she became the manager of a very nice hotel. Who would guess that years later she would be one of the many former Long Beach residents living in Champagne Village?

Gladys met Bob Wilkinson and, after dating a short time, they were married in October of 1966. Her daughters fondly called him, “Daddio”. He is currently living with a granddaughter in Florida, being "spoiled rotten", and still having his “happy hour” at 5, with gin and water.

Both Gladys and Bob were working when they bought their first home here. Later, they decided they needed a bigger place, so they bought #7 Live Oak Lane in 1978. Bob used to work at the golf shop until his vision got too bad.

Gladys, as a close friend said, was active in everything. She headed SAC for a time, started line dancing and played bridge and tennis. She became the local travel agent, arranging tours and trips. She also helped residents with personal travel arrangements. Whenever there was a social activity, Gladys would be there helping in any way she could.

This lady is going to be sorely missed, but we're sure she's now traveling on a first class ticket.
