HEALTH INSURANCE NEWS

One important service that Medicare covers is the transportation of an Ambulance or Paramedics with a 911 call. There are some conditions attached to that coverage that all seniors should be aware of.

Medicare covers ambulance trips only when they're medically necessary and reasonable. That means other transportation like a car or taxi could endanger your health. For example: Medicare probably won't pay for an ambulance if someone has a simple fractured ankle or arm. However, if that patient goes into shock or has internal bleeding, then it would be medically necessary.

Also very important to know is that an ambulance must take you to the nearest appropriate facility. This means the closest hospital equipped to treat your condition. A burn victim might travel across town to a burn unit instead of the local hospital. Since Palomar's emergency room is considered a trauma center it would be the nearest facility in our area most of the time. If your Advantage Plan does not cover Palomar, you would be covered because it is an emergency. Then you might be transferred to another in network hospital for ongoing care. If you insist on being taken to your favorite hospital, (not life threatening) you will be billed for the additional travel miles beyond Palomar.

Medicare does not cover transport in wheelchair vans as they do not meet the staffing and medical equipment to qualify for Ambulance coverage. Medicare does cover some non-emergency transport when someone is bed ridden or requires medical attention during transport.

The most common reason for nonpayment is the lack of information concerning condition or diagnosis. If an ambulance company bills you for services after Medicare denies payment, you should contact California Health Insurance Counseling & Advocacy Program (HICAP) at 1-800-434-0222. They can help you appeal the bill.

Important IRS Note for Those Who Have Tax Debt

The Internal Revenue Service reiterated its warning that taxpayers may not be able to renew a current passport or obtain a new passport if they owe federal taxes. To avoid delays in travel plans, taxpayers need to take prompt action to resolve their tax issues.

In January of last year, the IRS began implementing new procedures affecting individuals with "seriously delinquent tax debts." These new procedures implement provisions of the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act. The law requires the IRS to notify the State Department of taxpayers the IRS has certified as owing a seriously delinquent tax debt, which is \$52,000 or more. The law also requires State to deny their passport application or renewal. If a taxpayer currently has a valid passport, the State Department may revoke the passport or limit ability to travel outside the United States.

Ways to Resolve Tax Issues

There are several ways taxpayers can avoid having the IRS notify the State Department of their seriously delinquent tax debt. They include the following:

- Paying the tax debt in full,
- Paying the tax debt timely under an approved installment agreement,
- Paying the tax debt timely under an accepted offer in compromise,
- Paying the tax debt timely under the terms of a settlement agreement with the Department of Justice,
- Having requested or have a pending collection due process appeal with a levy, or having collection suspended because a taxpayer has made an innocent spouse election or requested innocent spouse relief.

PET RULES

Excerpts from the CV Rules & Regulations



Pet Owner Registration and Agreement

Prior to bringing a permanent cat or dog into Champagne Village, residents must obtain permission from the Association, execute a Pet Agreement, and register the pet by providing proof of vaccinations along with a current license and tag number (if applicable), and a photograph of the pet. All existing and new pets are subject to these registration requirements.

Pet Waste

No person owning or having charge of any pet will leave any animal waste within any of the common areas or on private property: this includes the pet walk areas and the pet park. All animal waste must be immediately picked up and deposited in one of the pet area trash receptacles or at the pet owner's home. Owners of pets not abiding by this policy are subject to the CVPOA Rules Enforcement Policy. **Note from the Community Manager: this also refers to picking up your pet's waste (dog or cat) from your neighbor's yard.**

Noise and Barking

Noise from a dog is defined as barking or whining for more than five minutes in any one hour period: Barking that is excessive or persistent and occurs for an extended period of time or on a repeated basis. When determining if barking is a violation, consideration will be given to the time of day, duration and frequency of barking. No resident is permitted to keep, maintain or permit within any unit, or within the common areas or on private property, any pet that disturbs the peace and comfort of other residents in Champagne Village or interferes with any person's reasonable and comfortable enjoyment of life or property

Unattended Pets

Owners must never leave their approved dogs unattended for more than 12 hours. Owners may not leave a pet tethered or unattended at any time. Any pet found running at large within the common areas or on any private property may be reported to the San Diego County Department of Animal Control.

No-Pet Areas

Whether on or off leash, pets are not permitted in any common areas not designated as a pet area. This includes but is not limited to the Village Hall, recreational areas, the laundry room and Gathering Place, the mail center, the golf practice area, the tennis courts, the pool area, the grassy portion of the picnic area, picnic area concrete patio and all streets and sidewalks not in the dog walk area. Pets are not permitted on any private property other than the pet-owner's property.

Dog-Walk Area

The dog-walk area spans an area starting at the rear of the stage and continuing to the intersection of Ironwood, then along Ironwood toward to the RV area and finally northeast to the intersection of Ironwood and Sumac.

Pets being walked in this area must be restrained by a substantial hand-held leash that is no longer than 6 feet, and must be in the charge of a responsible, competent adult who is physically capable of controlling the pet.

Dog Park

The fenced dog park is an off-leash area where pets are allowed to run free. Users of this area must abide by the posted Rules. **Note: dogs must stay on a leash until inside the pet park.**

4. Type your name. I suggest that you leave off your city: this will provide a list of all individuals with your name, allowing you to find any other cities where you previously lived. I found more unclaimed items for me when I left off the city, as I have also lived in other areas around San Diego.




