Board Meeting Notes Approvals:

Board Approves Purchase of Painting Equipment

The Board approved the purchase of a new power washer and paint sprayer to replace eight-year old equipment. This will allow the maintenance crew to paint the exterior of the common buildings while saving the Association \$10,000.00 to \$14,000.00 over the cost of having a painting contractor do the same work. The cost of this equipment is \$2800.00 and should last 6-10 years.

Office Copier to Be Replaced

A new lease for a high speed copier was approved by the Board which will have minimal financial impact on the Associations financials. Currently the total cost of coping is offset by the income from advertising in the CV Times. The new copier will increase production and allow staff to focus their time on other important items.
