COMMUNITY MANAGER'S MESSAGE

With summer approaching I thought it would be a good time to post the CV rules.

POOL

- Please shower before entering the pool.
- Please follow the pool hours as posted at the pool and as listed in this publication.
- Children must be accompanied by an adult. Persons under 14 may not use the spa!
- No glass bottles or containers allowed. Place trash in containers.
- Please return your chairs and lounges to their proper location.
- All pool users must be potty trained - **no swim diapers allowed.**
- Please cover the ping pong tables after use.
- For safety, keep the gate closed at all times.
- Report maintenance problems to the Office.
- Resident Joe Garvey has volunteered to periodically monitor the pool during the summer months. Please give him your cooperation.

GENERAL

- Speed limit for all of CV is **15 mph!**
- Golf carts are *not* to be operated by children under the age of 16.
- All golf carts must have space numbers affixed to them. Please check your cart; if you need numbers, please contact the Office.
- All resident vehicles must have a CV sticker placed on the driver side rear side window. These stickers are available in the Office.

TENNIS COURTS

- Children must be accompanied by a resident on the tennis courts.
- No black soled shoes allowed. No skates or roller blades.

PICNIC AREA

- Clean up after your picnic.
- Secure the trash can tops.
- Place hot coals in the ash can; do not put hot coals in trash.
- Do not leave plastic trash bags in area.
- Remove trash to the dumpster outside the Village Hall (get key from the Office).

OFFICE NOTES

GARAGES

- This applies to those lucky people with garages. The main purpose of garages is for the parking of vehicles, not storage. If you have a two car garage and two cars, both cars must be parked in the garage. Storage of items cannot preclude you from parking in the garage for any reason.
- Garage doors should only be open when you are entering or exiting the garage in your vehicle.

CHAMPAGNE VILLAGE HONOR FLIGHTS

Hundreds of people, civilian and military, gathered around the baggage claim at Lindberg Field in May to welcome home our local Champagne Village WWII heroes. **Tom McCue** and **John Martin** joined the ranks last month of the many veterans who have become a part of "Honor Flight".

Honor Flight began shortly after the official dedication of the World War II Memorial in Washington, DC in May of 2004. Since then the Honor Flight Network has been paying tribute to the veterans of "the greatest generation". It has, to date, transported more than 100,000 of these vets to see their memorial.

According to the Department of Veteran Affairs, an estimated 640 WWII veterans die each day. It is the mission of the program to give each one of them a chance to see their memorial while they are still alive. Currently the program has 127 hubs in 42 different states. It is a federal not-for-profit, funded through private contributions and is a totally "free ride" for the veterans. "It didn't cost us a thing," they raved, "we even got two free drinks."


"We had a wonderful trip," exclaimed **John Martin**, concerning his visit. The trip actually lasted only 3 days...2 of which were spent in the air. It comprised a whirlwind agenda beginning with breakfast at 6 am and lights out after 10 pm. "It's just a day of go, go, go," explained **Tom McCue**, "quite tiring...but very worthwhile and very emotional".

Tom served on the famous USS Enterprise as a fighter pilot during the last half of 1944 through February of 1945. He was attacking the Philippines, Iwo Jima, Formosa, Okinawa, and the South China Seas. He was an ensign in the Navy and received the Silver Star medal, the Distinguished Flying Cross medal, and several air medals.

After diesel school training at Iowa State and General Motors Factory School in Cleveland, **John** became a diesel engineering expert in the USN. He was assigned to USS SC (sub chaser) 1299 where as a Chief Petty Officer he spent 10 months at sea out of Rhode Island and Charleston, SC. He was then sent to Aruba and eventually San Diego when the bombs were dropped in Japan. He spent his last Navy days as a Lieutenant training new Ensigns for the Navy and was eventually discharged in November of 1945.

The World War II memorial visit was a highlight for the men. Every one of them had a personal guardian and a wheelchair to whirl them around from memorial to memorial. "There are 4,048 stars on the WWII memorial...one for every 100 Americans who died in the war," John explains.

"We were greeted by applause and crowds wherever we went," Tom remembered, "Everything was decorated...even the plane. In fact, when we got on the plane to head out to DC, there was a mail call. Each veteran got personal letters written by children and citizens in the San Diego area." And each participant received a personal letter from George Bush (the elder). He and Bob Dole were instrumental in the beginnings of the Honor Flight program.

We have a warning system in the Village at the mailboxes with a red flag that flies on Red Flag Days to encourage you to be extra careful with fire outside, especially stubbing out cigarettes!




