### WHAT ARE ALL THOSE WHITE LINES?

Many of you have seen the various white lines in the streets, along the sidewalks and even in your own yards. We will be installing about five miles of three-inch pipe, which will carry water from the well to about 45 locations around CV. Part of our contract with Green Horizons requires that all property affected will be returned to its original condition. This includes streets, sidewalks, landscaped areas and any residential property. If white lines appear on your property, we suggest that you take photos of the area **in case there are any problems**. I will be working very closely with the supervisor from Green Horizons to insure a smooth process. As we begin to work in your area, we will send out a flyer with more details. The plan is to do all the road crossings at one time and get that behind us as we move into the heavy trenching.

# 2018-2019 Annual Report

The last year was primarily consumed with the planning and implementation of the well project. I think most would agree this was wise use of the Board's time and resources due to the tremendous savings created by this project. As I write this report, we are beginning the costliest and most time-consuming portion of this project, which is installing 22,500 feet of pipe and connecting to the existing valves. This will certainly take several months and require constant supervision.

In conjunction with the well project, the Board made some significant financial policy changes to comply with the new civil code sections relating to financial oversight. Two Board members will now review and sign off on the monthly interim financial statements. They will also review all expenditures and sign off on any unbudgeted expense over \$10,000. CFO Roger Elyea has set up a tracking system for the well project, with a heavy focus on prompt repayment of reserve funds used for the well project. Repayment of funds used to bolster the operating account and prepay our insurance policy are also being made on a timely basis.

During last year's budgeting sessions, the Board made several contract changes to reduce expenses and eliminate the need for an assessment increase. Some of those actions were offset by several increases in other categories, thus making it very unlikely that assessments will remain constant next year.

As usual the maintenance staff has been busy working on a wide variety of projects. All exterior surfaces have been repaired and painted the new color palette, new door and window added to the kitchen, drip irrigation added to the landscape near 202-204, interior painting in the pool area, fence repair, concrete repair and all the normal reoccurring maintenance items and emergency repairs throughout the year.



## CV Residents and DSFPD Douse Fires in the Picnic Area By Greg Lorton #346

Fifteen Champagne Village residents combined forces with Deer Springs Fire Protection District personnel to fight numerous deliberately-set fires in the Picnic Area on May 22. Okay, well maybe it wasn't so dramatic or sinister as it sounds. The District and the CV Emergency Planning Committee hosted a fire extinguisher demonstration and training event. The District described the different kinds of extinguishers, their applicability to different kinds of fires, and their advantages and disadvantages. And then the residents in attendance each had the opportunity to put out fires burning gasoline and diesel-soaked paper. The District also demonstrated what happens when you use the wrong kind of extinguisher – in this case, a pressurized water extinguisher on burning liquid fuels. The extinguisher spread the fire without putting it out – a valuable lesson if you happen to have a pan of burning oil in the kitchen.



The May 11th CV Lions Club annual Italian Dinner was a huge success, thanks to the 188 Villagers who attended! We identified 13 of those children in need of further evaluation and referred them to eye doctors.

## HEALTH INSURANCE NEWS

Every few months we receive in the mail a flyer offering a series of ultra sound tests to detect conditions in our arteries and bones. I had a few questions about these services, so I asked our Cardiologist about the value of these tests. He said they can be beneficial in addition to the treadmill EKGs we had just completed. My next question was does Medicare cover these tests? Here is what I discovered.

Medicare Part B covers abdominal aortic screening by ultra sound if you are at risk. At risk means you have a family history of abdominal aortic aneurysms or you are a man ages 65-75 and have smoked 100 cigarettes in your lifetime. (I don't know what that means for women with the same history!) Under these conditions you pay nothing if the doctor accepts assignment (what Medicare pays). If you do not fall into this group, you should plan to pay for the test.

Also included in these screenings is a test for osteoporosis. This is a bone mass measurement. Medicare does cover this test every 24 months. You should have had one of these tests in your Welcome to Medicare exam at age 65 or first year in Medicare. This test is covered more often if you are at risk because you take prednisone or a steroid type of drug, or have hyperparathyroidism. This type of screening can also be ordered by your primary care physician.

Another area of testing that is becoming more important to seniors is in the diagnosis/preventive testing for Alzheimers. Blood panels and genetic testing for brain health can be very expensive. However, some blood tests may be covered by Medicare. At this time the only genetic testing usually covered is in relationship to treatment of cancers. Next generation sequencing can aid in the treatment of several cancers. BRCA1 and BRCA2 require diagnosis and/or family history to qualify for coverage.

Hopefully Medicare's new emphasis on preventive care will lead to more tests covered before diagnosis.


