




Champagne Village Well Update

By now you've noticed white lines on many of our streets, common areas and some of your yards. This 'artistry' is related to CV's well water project. Green Horizons, our contractor for this work, began marking the routes for new water lines in late April. Double lines on streets indicate where pavement has to be cut and trenched to bury lines, while dashed lines show where water lines are to be buried.

The project is being completed in ten phases (see the map below). Digging for Phase 1 began in early May, but progress slowed due to the steep slopes and a good deal of boulders that were encountered, forcing the crew to trench by hand. The crew finished Phase 1 on June 6th, and well water is now being used to irrigate this section of the Village. Work on Phase 2 began the following day. While mechanical trenching machines will be used as much as possible, many sloped areas in the Village will require digging by hand.

I've been asked how long the entire project will take: Green Horizons tells me their plan is to complete two phases per month, and complete all phases no later than November 1st. It sounds like an eternity, but the end will be here before we realize. This is hard and hot work for the Green Horizons crew - but they're doing their best to minimize disruption to our community. So when you pass by, give them a wave and a friendly greeting to show our appreciation!



CHAMPAGNE VILLAGE GRAND MARSHALS CHARLIE & BETTY SERVICE

Charlie and Betty moved to Champagne Village in August, 2003. Charlie had retired in 1999 from Civil Service after almost 30 years, and Betty was working in real estate. They both found it amusing that they chose CV because, early in their 37-year marriage when they drove from northern California where they lived down to San Diego to visit their children, they'd pass Champagne Village and comment that it looked like a nice place to live, nestled against the mountains and out of the city. At that point, they never dreamed that someday they would end up here.

Charlie served in the Army from 1968-1970, until he was shot in the knee while in Vietnam. He is the recipient of three Purple Hearts and various other service medals. After being medically discharged he eventually went to work for the government at Mare Island in Vallejo, CA. While on one of his trips to San Diego, he met Betty and they fell in love and married. Betty had to leave her two teenage sons as they didn't want to move and change schools.


In 1996 they moved to Rocklin, CA when Mare Island closed and he transferred to McClellan Air Force Base to finish his career. They lived in northern California for 18 years, and Charlie always promised his stepsons he would bring their mother back to San Diego after he retired. He kept his promise when they returned to San Diego in 1999.

They lived in East County for several years before moving to Champagne Village. Once here, Charlie jumped right in, served back-to-back terms on the Board, and became President. He was later appointed Disaster Chief and served on the Fire Safe Council. During this time Betty maintained her anonymity and was often referred to as Charlie's wife or Mrs. Charlie. This became a joke between them. That soon changed when Betty retired from real estate and became more involved in the community. She began playing golf with the Oaks Ladies Club and remains friends with these women. She also joined the Fountains Ladies Golf Club, where Betty served as President and other offices for both clubs. Charlie also joined the CV Men's Golf Club and made a name for himself as a competitive foe.

Charlie and Betty are not bystanders, as those of you who know them can attest. They both like to help out and make this Village the best it can be. They have attended almost all events held here and had been tagged, along with a group of close friends, 'The Wild Bunch.' They are now involved in SAC and enjoy participating in the many events held here. You can also find Betty working part-time in the Kiosk; be sure to stop and say hi!

Charlie, after taking some time off, ran for the Board again last year and is currently serving as President. He's also recuperating from surgery. The outpouring of love and support has been overwhelming while they've gone through the worst of times. Another reason to feel blessed to live in Champagne Village: it becomes your second family.

Betty and Charlie have never regretted making the decision to move to Champagne Village. They're extremely touched and honored to be the 2019 Grand Marshals of the 4th of July Parade.



HEALTH INSURANCE NEWS

The Social Security Administration has announced that a “processing error” occurred in January. **The result was that it did not deduct premiums from some seniors’ Social Security checks and it didn’t pay the insurance plans.** This would be easy for seniors to miss, assuming the amount change to be a cost of living increase, etc. This affected some drug coverage and Medicare Advantage plans.

Some seniors will be notified (if not already when you read this) as many as five months of premiums are overdue. If you receive a bill from your insurance company, **DO NOT DISREGARD** the bill. It is not a mistake or a scam. You may even be notified that your policy has been canceled for non-payment.

Medicare has stated that about 250,000 people are affected by this error. Medicare did not reveal how many plans or which companies have been unpaid. Aetna has stated that 43,000 of its members are affected and Humana said about 33,000 of its members are involved. United Health Care reported 32,000 affected. None of these members have lost coverage.

If this circumstance has affected you, you should pay the bill if you can, or negotiate a payment plan to catch up your premiums. If your policy was canceled, then you should contact HICAP (California’s Advocacy Program) at 1-800-434-0222. Companies are required to allow two months from the billing date for clients to make up the premiums.

One spokesperson stated that Medicare’s nearly 15-year-old IT system is to be blamed. He urgently recommends the agency to invest in new equipment.

Social Security expects to resume the premium deductions by June or July. If you have received any mail that has confused you regarding your premiums, contact your insurance company and ask them to explain it to you. Don’t panic, but do not ignore insurance notices until you fully understand how or if it applies to you.

Individuals Who Need Passports for Imminent Travel Should Contact IRS Promptly to Resolve Tax Debt

The Internal Revenue Service today reiterated its warning that taxpayers may not be able to renew a current passport or obtain a new passport if they owe federal taxes. To avoid delays in travel plans, taxpayers need to take prompt action to resolve their tax issues.

In January of last year, the IRS began implementing new procedures affecting individuals with “seriously delinquent tax debts.” These new procedures implement provisions of the Fixing America’s Surface Transportation (FAST) Act. The law requires the IRS to notify the State Department of taxpayers the IRS has certified as owing a seriously delinquent tax debt, which is \$52,000 or more. The law also requires State to deny their passport application or renewal. If a taxpayer currently has a valid passport, the State Department may revoke the passport or limit ability to travel outside the United States.

Ways to Resolve Tax Issues

There are several ways taxpayers can avoid having the IRS notify the State Department of their seriously delinquent tax debt. They include the following:

- Paying the tax debt in full,
- Paying the tax debt timely under an approved installment agreement,
- Paying the tax debt timely under an accepted offer in compromise,
- Paying the tax debt timely under the terms of a settlement agreement with the Department of Justice,
- Having requested or have a pending collection due process appeal with a levy, or having collection suspended because a taxpayer has made an innocent spouse election or requested innocent spouse relief


