New Business

- Approval of three new landscape installations for a total of \$13,080.00.
- Approval of a request by Joanne Hansen to host a Medicare Educational Seminar.
- Approval to utilize the CV Task Management System, BoardVue Software, owned by AAM.

Open Forum

Four residents came to the microphone to address their concerns listed below:

Question regarding 1 gallon vs. 5 gallon Little Johns to be placed on Esquire Slope.

Answer: The same number of plants would be installed and the higher price of the 1-gallon includes labor and one-year guarantee of plant life or replacement.

Question regarding who's responsible for the clean up of pool tiles and pool furniture.

Answer: Management is working with Pool Vendor for improved maintenance.

Question regarding where mulch piles will be relocated.

Answer: Up behind the maintenance shed, out of sight.

Question regarding improved communication when Vendors or Contractors are expected to be on homeowner property.

Answer: It is hard to know exactly when work is to be done on a property, but when possible a notice will be posted and/or provided.

HOW TO REPORT AN EMERGENCY

If you need to report an emergency that may endanger life or property (fire, gas leak) please call 911 immediately. To report maintenance emergencies call the Office (760) 749-8008 and stay on the line until you get a live person.

During office hours you will get either Karin or Tom; after hours you will get an operator who will contact us so we can determine the proper course of action for the particular emergency. One of your staff is on call 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year to handle emergencies. You may leave a non emergency message on the afterhours message service.

CHILDREN CANNOT DRIVE GOLF CARTS IN CV!

They MUST be 16 years old with a valid driver's license!

SECURITY DISCLAIMER

We always hope that our entry systems provide some deterrence to crime. However, no matter what steps we take the association can never be completely safe and secure. For example, it's possible for someone to enter the property under false pretenses to commit crimes, for residents to commit crimes against their own neighbors, for guests of residents to commit crimes, and for employees to commit crimes. As a result, the association is not and can never be free of crime and we cannot guarantee your safety or security. PROTECTING OUR PROPERTY VALUES:

Your role is more important than you think!

The primary mission of our Board is to preserve, protect and enhance our common interest: the property and assets of Champagne Village. But, just how does the Board guide the Association to carry out this mission?

Turns out that the Board of Directors has a pretty precise blueprint in our CC&Rs on how to protect our common investment. But Champagne Village is not just made up of the Board: our Association was established as a corporation in which ALL owners are members. This means that, **as an owner, you've committed yourself to be a business partner with every other owner in this community, and have specific duties to protect the common investment:**

To achieve the mission of preserving, protecting and enhancing property values, certain rules had to be established to make this possible. In your CC&Rs, the Board is given the authority to establish Rules and Regulations that compliment the Association's purpose. **When you follow the CC&Rs and these Rules and Regulations, you are doing your duty as a member of the Association.**

Architectural guidelines and procedures were established to promote aesthetic conformity

and eliminate architectural changes that threaten the investment other members have in the Association. **When you follow these guidelines and obtain approval before any changes are made, you are doing your duty as a member of the Association.**

The Board is made up of owners: fellow members just like you. They volunteer their time and energy to serve the Association because they care about the investment they have in it. Committees are formed to assist the Board with their work. These committees are made up of volunteer owners, just like you. **When you volunteer to serve on the Board of Directors or a committee, you're doing your duty as a member of the Association.**

Monthly assessments are necessary to protect, maintain and enhance our community assets. When owners fail to pay their assessment on time, the Association is often unable to meet all of its financial obligations. Even one owner who doesn't pay their assessment on time could adversely impact how Association business is conducted. **When you pay your assessment on time, you are doing your duty as a member of the Association.**

The Board of Directors meet on a regular basis to make decisions, stay up-to-date on Association business and to hear from fellow owners in order to make proactive business decisions. As owners, keeping abreast of Association matters and contributing during the Open Meeting is good business. **When you choose to attend Board meetings, you are doing your duty as a member of the Association.**

So, are you doing your duty? Remember: you not only own your home and unit, but also 1/457 of Champagne Village. Help protect our investment! Attend meetings (we serve cake!). Abide by the rules and policies, and kindly pay your fees on time. We're all depending on each other. Remember: you play a more important role than you think!



HEALTH INSURANCE NEWS

Summer and Fall is a great time to get out of town to travel far and wide. Even the most modern destinations have complications regarding a foreigner's health care. Medicare coverage includes emergencies within the United States only, with a few exceptions.

An emergency is usually defined as a condition threatening the loss of life or limb. Original Medicare does have a few exceptions: if you are in the U.S. but the nearest hospital is closer (i.e., Canada or Mexico); if you are traveling through Canada between Alaska and another U.S. state when an emergency occurs and the Canadian hospital is closer; and if you live in the U.S. and the foreign hospital is closer to your home regardless of whether it is an emergency.

Supplemental plans do offer 80% coverage for travel but it is typically a reimbursement which means you have to pay in cash to leave a foreign hospital. (Hope you have a large credit line.) In the U.S. you are covered along with Original Medicare.

Most Advantage (HMO) plans, however, do not cover you outside of your county or service area unless you have a multiple residence provision written in the contract.

Cruises and most other travel packages are only required to get you to the nearest medical facility and those with some coverage are usually reimbursements.

Bottom line for travel is to be prepared ahead of time. There are excellent travel insurance plans available at a nominal price by the day, week, month and annually for multiple trips in the same year. One company even has a phone application that will direct you to the nearest English speaking doctor or hospital.

Consider your peace of mind when planning all the other details of your trip. It is not worth the gamble that nothing will happen during your getaway. Planning ahead could save you thousands of dollars, not to mention soothing the trauma of an unexpected emergency.


