MESSAGE FROM TOM RIGGS, COMMUNITY MANAGER

Parking

I have noticed an increase in parking violations over the past several months. I realize we have a lot of new residents, however many of these violations are from long-time residents. Listed below are the basic parking rules; for complete rules please check your Rules and Regulations.

- The only place residents may park is in their carport or garage.
- No vehicle may park in the street overnight.
- Only guests may park in guest parking (see Rules and Regulations for exceptions).
- All parking is subject to posted notices (golf cart, compact, disabilities, etc.).
- **With proper notification any vehicle parked in violation of the Rules and Regulations may be towed at the owner's expense.**

Requests to the Board

Over the past several months there have been increasing number residents approaching individual Board members requesting Directors to help facilitate some form of action or request. These requests range from speeding up action work orders to ideas or suggestions for rule changes, improvements to common area, etc. The Association has a protocol for communicating to the Board which requires that **all requests be put in writing and be directed to the entire Board. Individual Board members cannot take any action and it is inappropriate to contact them regarding these issues.** Each Board member volunteers a significant amount of time to their job as a Director and has agreed to follow this protocol. The sooner the entire Board sees an item, the sooner a course of action can be set in place. Not all items will make it to the Board meeting agenda, however all items will be reviewed. **This is very important if you wish to see something go before the Board since we will no longer have Agenda meetings prior to our monthly Board meetings.**

The Office receives over 100 work order requests in any given month along with the hundreds of scheduled and routine maintenance items. The staff's job is to prioritize those items and to get the work done in the most efficient and cost effective way possible. As you can imagine everyone feels that their request should be given top priority. That is neither practical nor possible. You may contact me to check on the status of your request, but keep in mind that this will not speed up the process. Thank you for your cooperation.

NOT EVERYTHING YOU HEAR IS TRUE

When you live in a community as close-knit as ours, you're bound to hear gossip about lots of things regarding the Board, CVPOA funds, or Association happenings. Please consider that much of what you hear may not be accurate. In fact, much of it might be so exaggerated that it's not even true. If you happen upon any news or rumor you're not certain of, confused about or concerned with, please contact the Office so we can set the record straight for you.


Why Bother Attending Board Meetings?

If you're not regularly attending CV Board meetings, you're not taking advantage of your right to observe and participate in the decision-making process that protects, preserves and enhances Champagne Village's assets and, ultimately, your own property values.

As part of the Open Meeting Act, Association members are given the opportunity to directly address the Board during Board meetings. Cake is served at the end of each meeting, giving us a chance to socialize with neighbors and fellow residents. We encourage everyone to attend our Board meetings, typically held on the third Thursday of each month. Come to stay informed and respectfully ask questions, then stay for the cake!

HOW TO REPORT AN EMERGENCY

If you need to report an emergency that may endanger life or property (fire, gas leak) please call 911 immediately. To report maintenance emergencies call the Office **(760) 749-8008** and stay on the line until you get a live person.

One of your staff is on call 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year to handle emergencies. During office hours you will get either Tami or Tom; after hours you will get an operator who will contact a staff member to determine the proper course of action for the particular emergency. You may leave a non emergency message on the afterhours message service.

Remember, all drivers must be at least 16 years old with a valid driver's license to drive a golf cart in Champagne Village!



WE'RE ALL RESPONSIBLE FOR SECURITY

We always hope that our entry systems provide some deterrence to crime. However, no matter what steps we take, the Association can never be completely safe and secure. For example, it's possible for someone to enter the property under false pretenses to commit crimes, for residents to commit crimes against their own neighbors, for guests of residents to commit crimes, and for employees to commit crimes. As a result, the Association is not and can never be free of crime and we cannot guarantee your safety or security. Accordingly, you should NOT rely on the Association to protect you from loss or harm.

Instead, you should provide for your own security by taking common sense precautions, such as carrying insurance against loss, keeping your doors locked, refusing to open your door to strangers, asking workers for identification, installing a security system, locking your car, etc. You may also wish to check various websites and law enforcement lists to be aware of those living in your area.

The office will be closed on Thursday, August 8 and Friday, August 9 for off-site training; please plan ahead for keys, etc.

All garbage and refuse must be well wrapped and placed in designated containers for pickup. Trash containers must not be put out prior to 4:00pm the evening before collection. Trash containers must be taken in as quickly as possible following trash collection, and kept in an area not easily visible from the street.

STOP MEANS STOP!

Please remember: when you come to a stop sign, you need to make a complete stop! Bicycle riders & golf cart drivers are NOT exempt from fully STOPPING at these signs. Thanks!





HEALTH INSURANCE NEWS

This month's article is about a very important subject for Medicare recipients. **It is a scam/fraud alert regarding Hospice care.** Hospice fraud is one of the top three types of Medicare fraud reported in California. The result of these cases has not only been financial loss but loss of access to medical treatment, medications and even early death.

Hospice is a wonderful organization that provides help to those in the last months or weeks of life. They comfort and counsel families and are experts in pain management (palliative care). Hospice is covered by Medicare. In Hospice your Medicare benefits change to focus only on palliative care, not curative care. Therefore, one's primary care doctor no longer controls the medications or treatment received. A privately-owned Hospice care organization handles all the medical care. This is where the scammers try to take advantage of families needing help.

A valid Hospice enrollment should always include the patient's doctor and family's decision. Hospice organizations can be researched. Scams happen when families or patients are approached by a cold call person/nurse to the hospital room or home making promises usually not even covered by Medicare.

To avoid scams:

- Beware of being enrolled if you have more than six months to live (why your doctor should be involved.)
- Beware if you are offered free services like housekeeping, cooking and cleaning (Medicare does not cover these services.)
- Guard your Medicare ID. Do not give out to strangers.
- Call Medicare if all your medications stop being covered to make certain you have not been enrolled in Hospice.
- If you have turned down an offer to enroll in Hospice and are not ready, tell the nurses and doctors treating you at the hospital.
Make it clear your family is taking you home.

Taxpayers should look out for new versions of these two scams

With scam artists hard at work all year, taxpayers should be on the lookout for a surge of evolving phishing emails and telephone scams.

Taxpayers should watch for new versions of two tax-related scams. One involves Social Security numbers related to tax issues. The other threatens taxpayers with a tax bill from a fictional government agency. Here are some details about these scams to help taxpayers recognize them:

The SSN scheme

- The latest twist includes scammers claiming to be able to suspend or cancel the victim's Social Security number. This scam is similar to and often associated with the IRS impersonation scam.
- It is yet another attempt by con artists to frighten taxpayers into returning robocall voicemails.
- Scammers may mention overdue taxes in addition to threatening to cancel the taxpayer's SSN.

Fake tax agency

- This scheme involves a letter threatening an IRS lien or levy.
- The scammer mails the letter to the taxpayer.
- The lien or levy is based on bogus overdue taxes owed to a non-existent agency.
- The fake agency is called the "Bureau of Tax Enforcement." There is no such agency.
- The lien notification scam also likely references the IRS to confuse potential victims into thinking the letter is from a legitimate agency.

Both these schemes show classic signs of being scams. The IRS and its Security Summit partners – the state tax agencies and the tax industry – remind everyone to stay alert to scams that use the IRS or reference taxes. Being alert is especially important in late spring and early summer as tax bills and refunds arrive. Remember, the IRS never phones you for issues.




MODEL BUILDING

DISPOSAL OF MEDICINES YOU NO LONGER NEED

If your medicine cabinet contains expired prescription medications or any you no longer take, the best way to dispose of them is through the drug take back program. The nearest DEA authorized kiosk is at CVS on El Norte, next to the pharmacy, is open 24/7. There is also a kiosk at the Escondido Police Department on Center City Parkway, which is open during regular business hours.

It is recommended that you obliterate your name on the label to protect your privacy. Flushing medications down the drain is not recommended as some might be harmful to ocean creatures and our soil. Vitamins and over-the-counter medicines can be safely disposed in the trash.
