### OFFICE NOTES

**WATER INFORMATION:** During the recent replacement of the supply lines and installation of meters to all the spaces from 205 through 459 we installed separate shut off valves for both irrigation systems and the service to homes. This feature allows residents to shut water off to the house while still using their irrigation systems during vacations. If you need further information contact the office.

**PET PROBLEM:** The Common Area Landscape Committee has received several reports that some people who are walking their dogs on the fire road near Sumac are not cleaning up after their dogs. This is a violation of both the CVPOA Rules and Regulations and the State health and Safety Code. Also pets are not allowed on the grass portion of the picnic area. Please report violators to the Office.

### *Getting to Know...Rob Jacobson*

Recently four residents played in an exhibition tennis match here on our courts. All four were great players. There might have been a question as to who was the best, but Rob was the oldest. Tennis is not his first love, his family is! Rob, one of four children, was born in Jersey City, New Jersey a little over eighty years ago. His family moved to the Los Angeles area when he was five. He attended elementary school in Arcadia then went to a high school for the cities of Monrovia, Arcadia and Duarte that the students called MAD. It's no surprise that he earned a varsity letter in tennis. He went to Pasadena J. C. after graduating from high school in 1938. He got a job at Lockheed in 1940 building airplanes and eventually wound up making P-38s. By this time the war had started and so Rob was working many hours.

Meanwhile, a new family moved in next door with twin girls. One of the twins caught Rob's eye and he knew she was the one. She really must have been because Rob and Marge have been married for sixty years.

In 1944 Rob was "asked to join" the Marines. He was a member of a rocket platoon and was involved in the occupation of Okinawa and China. He got out in 1946 with some health problems due to having had pneumonia twice while in the Marines.

Because of his respiratory problems, Rob and Marge moved from the bad air of Arcadia to the mountains of Big Bear. They were able to get a lot and then proceeded to build their own house. Later, it was necessary for Rob to go back down the "hill" to get a job. He went to work at Northrop helping to convert the flying wing reciprocal engine to a jet engine. When an opening at the Big Bear Post Office came up, Rob became a clerk. After five years he became a supervisor, then an assistant postmaster and later was the acting postmaster. When Marge and Rob first got married they decided they wanted a big family. So two boys and eight girls later their family was complete. All attended Big Bear High School and when the youngest daughter, a valedictorian, graduated in 1972 the school year book was dedicated to the Jacobson family.

Rob and Marge are very proud of their family and eagerly tell about each one but the most outstanding thing is that all of their children are still married to their original partners. Maybe that's because of the example their parents have set.

Marge's sister-in-law who lived in England came for a visit. She had watched the Welk show on the "telly" and wanted to see the Welk Resort. So she and Marge took a look. When they returned home to San Marcos where Marge and Rob had moved to escape the cold and snow of the mountains, Marge asked Rob if he was ready to move. That was twenty years ago.

After moving to the Village, Rob started giving tennis lessons but now says he has passed that on to Stan Daily. He says that playing less competitive tennis is much more enjoyable. He also says that because of the people, he has never enjoyed any other living place more.

Rob gives Marge credit for so much saying that she has been the foundation of their marriage.
