Guest Parking Passes



In order to better monitor parking in the common area we will be instituting a program we have used in the past. If you have a guest who will be staying for more than a day, please notify gate and they will prepare a pass dated for the duration of their stay.

The pass will be available when they arrive and must be placed on the dash of the vehicle while it is parked in guest parking. If your guest is arriving after hours you may pick up a pass from the Office prior to their arrival. This will assist us in tracking parking and prevent any unnecessary or accidental towing of vehicles.

Proposed Additions to the Rules and Regulations 9/19/19

The two proposed changes below will be on the October Agenda for Board approval. If you have any comments, questions or suggestions please put them in writing and submit them to the Office prior to next month's Board Meeting.

The reason for change #1 is to allow residents to park their motorcycles on their unit space which is currently prohibited. The reason for addition#2 is to ensure that facilities are reserved for residents, owners and their guests.

1. Motorcycles and motor scooters **owned and operated by owners or residents**, may be operated within the community, only to ride to and from any entrance while proceeding directly to their residence.
2. Any person who is Caregiver shall not use any of the Association Common Area facilities or equipment or enter into any of the Association recreational or other areas as are listed below except and solely to the extent that such use or entry is necessary in order to provide needed or reasonably requested assistance to a Care Recipient for whom such Caregiver is responsible. Subject to the exception above, the facilities, equipment and areas which may not be used or entered into by a Caregiver (and which facilities, equipment or areas are intended for the sole benefit and use of non-Caregiver residents and their bona fide non-Caregiver guests) are as follows:
 1. Fenced in Swimming Pool and Fitness Room Area
 2. Bocce Ball Court and Putting Green Area
 3. Fenced in Tennis Courts
 4. Shuffleboard Area
 5. Fenced in Dog Park
 6. Association Clubhouse with the exception of the Association Office and Front Entrance leading to the Office
 7. Laundry Room

For the purposes of this Rule, the following shall apply: The term "Caregiver" shall mean a person 18 years of age or older if that person is providing live-in health care, live-in supportive care, or supervision to a Care Recipient and such Caregiver would not otherwise be entitled to reside long term in a senior community. The term "Care Recipient" shall mean a homeowner or senior homeowner (as such terms are used or defined in Civil Code Section 799.9) who lawfully resides in a Unit within the Association.



We are thankful for our park and by the way it was funded by many of our residents. The Board also chipped in to support this great project!




The map and chart below show the progress being made in the installation of the well irrigation system.



It seems that there wasn't much work done on the installation of piping this past month, due to the Green Horizon crew spending two weeks repaving trenches. The trenches on Terrace, Skyline Dr., Camphor and in front of the Laundry building were filled and resurfaced with asphalt. It was something we felt was necessary to take care of at this time. Phase 6, although marked complete on the map, still requires fine tuning. Phases 7 and 9 are still in process, with the digging of trenches and laying of pipe ongoing.

In discussions with Tom Riggs and our CFO, Roger Elyea, I can report that we have seen a significant reduction on our dependence on water from the Valley Center Water District. Our water costs for landscaping irrigation have been dropping. Additionally, we're tracking the amount of water being pumped from the well. The accompanying chart clearly shows the increasing quantity of water being provided from the well, on a daily basis. The data on this chart was collected between July 15 and September 19, 2019. Your patience with all that's going on, navigating detours and sand-filled trenches, is much appreciated.



The chart below shows how much water the well is producing. It represents a time span from July 16 through August 17. Note the increase of well water used for irrigation. The low spots will fill in as the remaining phases are completed. Each gallon of well water is that much less we have to purchase from Valley Center.



HEALTH INSURANCE NEWS

October brings us to another annual enrollment period for Medicare recipients. October 15th to Dec 7th is the enrollment period for any changes you want to make for Jan 1st, 2020. It's mostly good news!

Medicare Advantage plans are making quite a few changes for 2020. For example, Aetna is embedding dental care in some of its plans while United HealthCare is removing embedded dental and offering a wider variety of ancillary dental plans. In 2019 United HealthCare also dropped Silver Sneakers in favor of adding YMCA membership, mental health exercises and nutritional courses. Humana has expanded its dental coverage and several companies now include a personal alert system free of charge. There are considerable changes in the area of hearing aids, vision, and transportation miles. Some of the additional benefits are now allowances so beneficiaries can go to the provider they want. Several companies have reward programs that give Over-the-Counter dollars that can be spent through catalogue purchases for non-prescription supplies

Please be certain to check out our Annual Change Letter that should be arriving this week! Find out if your plan has new benefits so you can utilize all your plan's benefits. Also be certain that your drug coverage has not changed in a significant way regarding your drug list. Covered California is also experiencing considerable change for 2020. Legislation has passed for a State subsidy that will be added to the Federal subsidy that is based on the Federal Poverty level. This new subsidy will further aid those in the middle-class income range. What I have seen so far is that the change will greatly benefit those 60 and over who pay a high premium just before their Medicare years. This California State subsidy is only funded for five years but it will help many of those within the 400% up to 600% income range. (The Federal subsidy ends at 400% above the poverty level.)

The State of California has also reinstated a penalty for those without insurance. The penalty takes effect January 1, 2020. Everyone under 65 should be alerted to the new statewide law to get enrolled in a health insurance plan. Hopefully the new additional State-funded subsidies will make more plans affordable for those who have dropped their insurance. Subsidies only apply to those enrolled through Covered CA. Contact your agent for quotes as we have been alerted to the fact in some cases private plans may still be less expensive.

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION (QCD)

In general, distributions from a traditional IRA are taxable in the year received. However, a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) is generally a nontaxable distribution made directly by the trustee of your traditional IRA (other than a SEP or SIMPLE IRA) to an eligible charitable organization. If all of the qualifications are met, a QCD is nontaxable and you cannot claim a charitable contribution deduction for it. For individuals who do not itemize, taking a QCD can help lower taxable income.

Qualifications and Rules

Certain qualifications must be met:

- You must be at least age 70½ when the distribution is made.
- The maximum annual exclusion for QCDs is \$100,000 per taxpayer. Any QCD in excess of the \$100,000 exclusion limit is included in income as any other distribution. If you file a joint return, your spouse can also have a QCD and exclude up to \$100,000.
- All or part of your required minimum distribution (RMD) may be included in the QCD.
- You must have the same type of acknowledgment of your contribution that you would need to claim a deduction for a charitable contribution.
- A charitable contribution deduction on Schedule A (Form 1040), *Itemized Deductions*, cannot be claimed for any QCD not included in income.
- The QCD amount is limited to the amount of the IRA distribution that would otherwise be included in income. If your IRA includes nondeductible contributions, the distribution is first considered to be paid out of otherwise taxable income.
- If you need further information, please contact your insurance agent.



PARKING: Your Questions Answered

Where can residents park? Besides your carport or driveway, residents may park in any area designated for parking - including on the street - throughout the day, so long as you obey any posted signs.

Is it okay for residents to park in guest parking? YES - either when a guest vehicle is parked in your carport or driveway, or when your carport/driveway is temporarily inaccessible. However, under these conditions you MUST notify the Office regarding where your car will be parked, and how long it will be there. Generally, most carports can accommodate three vehicles. Unless you have three vehicles, or your carport is damaged have your guests park in your carport.

Can I park on the street? YES, but only during daytime hours, and only in areas where you are not blocking traffic or another resident's driveway and are obeying any posted signs. However, overnight street parking is NOT allowed.

Where can my guests park? Your guests can park in your carport or driveway. By day, they can park on the street and in designated areas throughout the Village, so long as they obey any posted signs. Overnight guests may also park in guest parking areas - but you must notify the Front Gate when you have overnight guests, so they can be provided a guest parking pass. This will identify their car as approved for overnight parking in a guest parking area. Vehicles parked in Guest parking must have passes displayed on the vehicle dash area.

What should I do if I see a car parked for several days? First, check the windshield for a guest parking pass - this will indicate that the car is approved for overnight parking in a guest parking area. If you don't see one, check the driver's side rear window for a CV decal: this will indicate that the car belongs to a resident. Next, contact the Office with this information, as well as the license plate and location.

How do I make sure that my car doesn't get towed? First, make sure you have a CV sticker on the driver's side rear window of your car (they're available FREE at the Office window in the Hall). Second, make sure you do not park overnight anywhere other than your driveway or carport - unless you have approval to do so from the Office. Third, contact the Front Gate whenever you have overnight guests. Should your Guest visit you after gate hours and is intending to park in Guest parking overnight and longer then get the Guest pass upon the gate opening the next morning.

What about my golf cart? Resident golf carts can only be parked in areas designated for them, or along the street by day - and should NEVER be parked overnight anywhere, other than your carport or driveway. They must also be labeled with your space number, for easy identification. Parking on gravel and/or grass and dirt areas is not allowed by all vehicles, including golf carts.

These stated rules are necessary to allow emergency vehicles access to every home in the Village at all times and especially at night when more emergencies do occur.

Be sure to check for more details in the Rules and Regulations. Call the Office if you have any other questions.

IF YOU NEED HELP

DISPOSAL OF MEDICINES YOU NO LONGER NEED

If your medicine cabinet contains expired prescription medications or any you no longer take, the best way to dispose of them is through the drug take back program. The nearest DEA authorized kiosk is next to the CVS Pharmacy at El Norte which is open 24/7. There is also a kiosk at the Escondido Police Department on Center City Parkway, which is open during regular business hours.

It is recommended that you obliterate your name on the label to protect your privacy. Flushing medications down the drain is not recommended as some might be harmful to ocean creatures and our soil. Vitamins and over-the-counter medicines can be safely disposed in the trash.


VESPERS is a NON-DENOMINATIONAL group that gathers the first Sunday of each month for fellowship and communion. Everyone is welcome!
