Getting To Know...Charles Maurer By LoReta Phelps

Charles, sometimes known as Charlie, was born in Lake City, Colorado, in 1910. When he was five, his family moved to San Diego. His father, who was born in Switzerland, was a Swiss watchmaker wanted to open his own jewelry store, which he did, in Chula Vista. He was also the Watch Inspector for the Santa Fe Railroad, which had a terminus in Chula Vista.

Charlie went to Sweetwater High School, where he played basketball and went out for track. When he was in his junior year, he had to have surgery on his foot, which ended his athletic activities.

After high school, Charles attended San Diego State, and then transferred to University of Minnesota. He said that it was economically better, as he could ride the train to Minnesota for \$50, and the out-of-state tuition was also \$50. Later, he came

back to California and finished his schooling at U.C.L.A., in 1936. His chosen fields of interests were Chemistry, Physics and Mathematics. He really wanted to be a dentist, but the costs of schooling was just too much, so he went to work for the Mennen Company.

When the war started, his friends wanted him to join the Navy, but Charles thought that none of the services would take him because of his foot surgery. This turned out to be a mistake. He was drafted into the Army! The Mennen Company paid him half of his salary until he got a commission by attending O.C.S., and becoming a Lieutenant. In the Army, he was put into Chemical Warfare, which was renamed Medical Administration, and was sent to Texas as a Medical Supply Officer. He eventually wound up on Saipan. His commanding officer got sick and was sent home, so Charles was given the position. He says he was a second lieutenant doing a major's job, but that's the Army for you. He spent four years on Saipan, and got out as a Captain in 1946.

In 1947, he was introduced to his wife, Betty Ann, by her sister Jane. Charlie says, "And that was it." He and Betty Ann built a house, but couldn't move in because they weren't married. So, on April 23, 1949, they went to Las Vegas. Funny thing, they really didn't like Las Vegas, but they wanted to get married. The ceremony took place in a Lutheran Church that was partially under construction.

Charlie became an instant father to Betty Ann's son, Gary, who had never seen his father because he had been a war casualty in Europe. Another son, Charles Christopher, was added in 1954. The Maurer's now have six grandchildren, and are expecting number seven shortly.

After Charlie retired in 1975, he started selling his own formulas of gentle skin care products. The business grew rapidly, and in about five years he turned it over to their son, Chris, who still operates the company today.

Betty Ann's sister, Jane, was not only instrumental in getting them together, but she was also instrumental in getting them to Champagne Village. They would come to visit her here quite often. Charlie liked the visits because everyone was so friendly. He came home one day and said to Betty

Ann, "Let's move." So move they did, from West Los Angeles to Champagne Village, in 1988. Charlie has especially liked playing golf, saying, "I was lousy, but I loved it." As time did its thing, he had to give up the course for our practice area. Betty Ann began referring to it as, "Charlie's Golf Course". That, too, is now history.
