BOARD MEETING NOTES

The Board approved the 2013 Budget which includes a \$2 per month assessment increase. The assessments have remained level at \$190 per month for the last four years. This equates to a 1% increase (.2% per year for 5 years).

A request by a homeowner to have the association pay for a repair to her block skirting damaged by a root from a common area tree was denied based on advice from both our insurance company and the Association's attorney.

The Board approved a lease proposal from Officia Imaging which will save the Association \$2,700 per year over our current lease and increase our advertising space by 20 pages (a po-

tential income increase of \$12,000 or more).

Staff will be installing 22 new accent lights in the Village hall to replace the 40 year old unsafe, outdated, inefficient lighting.

The Board approved a Reserve expenditure to repair 70 ft. of asphalt caused by a lateral water line break.

BALLOT DEADLINE

The deadline for returning your bylaw amendment ballot is November 20, 2012. We would encourage everyone to return your ballot as soon as possible. A quorum is 229 ballots and we hope that we have good participation on this ballot measure. The Board is encouraging you to cast a vote for approval.

- Next regular Board of Directors Meeting is Wednesday, November 21 at 1 pm in the Village Hall.







SCAMS TO WATCH OUT FOR

Wells Fargo Scam A call from Wells Fargo introducing their new 360 Club and trying to get some of your personal information over the phone. If you have an account with Wells Fargo they already have all of your information! Tell the caller you'll call Wells Fargo *directly* about it. They will probably hang up, you hang up if they don't.

VISA / MasterCard / American Express Scam A call from the Security & Fraud Department at VISA / MasterCard / American Express telling you your card has been flagged for an unusual purchase pattern and they are calling to verify. The caller will say he needs to verify you are in possession of your card and will ask for the last 3 numbers on the back of your card which are the Security Numbers that verify you are the possessor of the card. The real VISA will never ask for anything on the card as they already know the information since they issued the card. Simply tell the caller that you'll call VISA *directly* to report a fraudulent purchase.

TOP SCAMS FROM SNOPE'S

Tough economic times are, unfortunately, boom times for scammers, as people desperate for money and jobs let down their guards and are more likely to pursue questionable financial opportunities that caution might ordinarily warn them away from. And as folks become more inured to monetary woes, their charitable inclinations are more easily exploited by scammers pretending to be persons in need of sympathetic helping hands. Listed below are several pervasive forms of scams that have proven particularly alluring to potential victims when times are tough. **Do not give out your bank account or credit card number over the phone if you didn't initiate the call to a reputable, known company. Be very reluctant to do business with any outfit that calls you (telemarketer) rather than the other way around.**

Nigerian Scam

A wealthy foreigner who needs help moving millions of dollars from his homeland promises a hefty percentage of this fortune as a reward for assisting him.

Foreign Lottery Scam Announcements that you've won large sums of money. You need to pay the taxes, frequently \$3000+, before they can release the money. You have won nothing. Do not send any money. They frequently phone back and are very persistent. They will say that they know where you live, become threatening and mention some identifying feature of your home like the 'red car' in the driveway. They are using Google Earth which has documented most of the roads in the United States.

Secret Shopper Scam Advertisers seek applicants for paid positions as 'secret' or 'mystery' shoppers.

Work-at-Home Scam Advertisers offer kits that enable home workers to make money posting links on the Internet.

Family Member in Distress Scam Scammers impersonate distressed family members in desperate need of money. Your instinct is to ask, 'Is this Bobby or Johnny?' Do not. Ask which grandchild, niece, etc. is calling. Don't give them the information they need to con you. Better yet, tell them to call their parents for you so they know where their children are and everyone is informed.
