BOARD MEETING NOTES/ACTIONS

October 17th

- The Board voted to approve effective Nov 10th, a 60 day trial period during which residents would be able to ride their motorcycles from the entrances to their homes or from their homes to the exits. After the 60 day trial period the board will vote on whether to make this a permanent rule .
- By majority vote the Board approved a rule change that would prohibit caregivers from using the common area facilities.
- An investment recommendation from MSSB was approved.
- The board voted to approve a proposal from Green Horizon to remove sand and silt from the drainage basin at the boundary of Champagne Village and Welk Resort, to comply with the San Diego County regulations regarding storm water runoff.
- By majority vote , the board approved a request from The Young and the Rest of Us, to place banner in the common area to promote the CV Holiday Market.
- A reserve expenditure to purchase a new pool heater to replace a failed unit, was approved.

It was announced that the Board had voted by secret ballot to appoint Susie Riley as the CV Times Editor.



By the time we've published this edition of the CV Times, our new CVPOA WEBSITE will be up and running. This site offers many of the same features as before, including the latest CV Times newsletter, governing docs, calendar and so much more:

- A searchable resident directory
- An interactive calendar that now shows all events and reservations for private events
- Links to pay your CVPOA bill online and review your past payments
- Online forms to request common area maintenance or to report a violation
- Forms to submit calendar events and reserve facilities
- All Board meeting minutes, agendas and financials

To log in to our new website, you'll need to register for a new username and password (the one you currently use will not work):

- 1 Click on SIGN IN at the upper right corner of the screen.
- 2 Beneath the NEW USER header, click on SIGN UP.
- 3 Fill in ALL information needed using the instructions next to each entry box.
- 4 Create a sign-in and password for yourself: be sure to write this down and keep in a safe place.
- 5 Select how you'd like to receive correspondence from us, including notices and newsletters.
- 6 Read and agree to the Terms of Service.

Once your information is reviewed, you'll receive approval that you can log into the website.

Reserving CV Facilities

Where can I plan a private event? Any CV resident can reserve the Hall, Card Room, Gathering Place or Picnic Area for private gatherings, depending on their availability. The pool area is cannot be reserved.

What kinds of events can I have? These common areas are perfect for weddings, anniversaries, birthdays, memorials and celebrations, for either yourself or a member of your immediate family (a spouse, sibling, child, son- or daughter-in-law, parent, grandparent or grandchild). You cannot reserve CV facilities on behalf of friends or other relatives. You must be present at your event.

Can I hold a business event? Commercially based events are only permitted in CV facilities upon your written request and the approval, in writing, of the Board of Directors - and these events must be open to all residents and their guests.

How do I place a reservation request? You can either fill out a paper form (located to the right of the Office window) or log into the new CVPOA website, where you can fill out this form online. Either way, don't mail those invitations for your event until you've heard directly from the Office regarding whether your request was approved.

How do I know if one of the facilities is available? We suggest that you log into the new CVPOA website and review the calendar to determine availability for specific dates, times and locations. You can also contact the Office if needed.

How much does it cost? Security deposits for use of facilities must be provided to the Office at least eight days prior to the event. The deposit amount may vary, depending on the type and size of the event and where it will be held. Refunds of your deposit (less any deductions) will be returned within 14 days following the event.

What if I need (or DON'T need) the kitchen? Please let the Office know this. If your event does not require the kitchen, it may be provided to another resident in for their event.

How do I arrange for a specific setup of tables, extra chairs, etc.? If you need assistance with setup, you'll need to fill out a Work Order form, providing specific instructions on what's needed and where it will go. You should do this at least two weeks prior to your event. Charges vary for these Work Orders, depending on their complexity. Check with the Office for more information.

What if I need the audio/video system or stage lighting? Be sure to detail this in your reservation request. An additional security fee or charge will be required for use of these systems. In addition, you may need assistance from one of our trained residents who is familiar with their use: having them on hand when you need them may be important to the success of your event.

What about parking for my guests? Your guests are welcome to use the parking area to the right of the CV Hall, all designated guest parking throughout the Village, and designated parking at the picnic area. In addition, street parking is permitted, so long as all posted signs are observed, resident driveways are not blocked, and no cars remain on the street overnight. It's important to note that any parking violations incurred by your guests are YOUR responsibility. For larger parties, we suggest that you arrange for a valet service or have guests carpool.

Can I decorate these areas for my event? Yes, so long as you don't attach anything to the walls or ceilings of CVPOA facilities. No tape, nails or other adhesives are permitted. In addition, you may not remove any decorations already in place without prior approval from either the Office or SAC. For details, refer to your Rules and Regulations - and for questions, contact the Office.

As Host, what are my responsibilities? In short, you ensure that you AND YOUR GUESTS abide by all CVPOA rules as specified in your Rules and Regulations. You must also ensure that all facilities you use are left in clean, orderly condition: you'll be charged a janitorial fee if you don't. You are responsible for any damage or theft, as well as the payment of any fees incurred as a result.



The map and chart below show the progress being made in the installation of the well irrigation system.



As of this writing (10/17/19), all road trenches have been repaved. No sooner was this completed, when trenching was begun on Ironwood View!


The overall progress of the project is going as expected. On the map below, you'll find more completed areas than last month. You'll also see what's scheduled for November and December.

Questions related to 'pipe laying' relative to trenching have been asked. The most frequent concerns PVC pipes not in trenches; either laying exposed or with just a covering of dirt. You may find this in areas where rocks or boulders make it impractical to trench. Rather than spend the time and effort to jackhammer a trench where there is no yard, foot traffic or vehicular traffic, a UV-resistant PVC pipe is used. The preference, however, is to trench.

The chart below shows how much water the well is producing, from July 16 through October 17th. Note the increase of well water used for irrigation. The low spots will fill in as the remaining phases are completed. Each gallon of well water is that much less we have to purchase from Valley Center



HEALTH INSURANCE NEWS

November lands right in the middle of Medicare's Annual Enrollment Period (AEP) Oct 15th to Dec 7th. Whatever plan or changes you make, the last plan you have by Dec 7th is the plan you'll have Jan 1, 2020.

During this period, we are also in Open enrollment for the Affordable Care Act for Individual Family Plans both on or off the Covered California Exchange until January 31st. I want remind those under 65 that California has reinstated a statewide penalty for not having Health Insurance. The State penalty will show up in your California Franchise State tax bill in 2021 for those without insurance during 2020.

When trying to decide on a Medicare Plan it is very important to evaluate your health needs. Advantage Plans are HMO's that replace the Federally funded Original Medicare. Private companies are given your Medicare funds to provide care through a specific network of Doctors. They usually include drug coverage and often add extra benefits such as hearing, vision and maybe dental. These companies are given additional funds by the government according to their star ratings. These star ratings indicate customer satisfaction and quality of care overall.

Some Advantage plans have plans that are directed toward diabetic care, heart conditions or another may be better for those who need unlimited chiropractic or acupuncture. It is to your advantage to mention what is a priority to you and your health care needs to mention these details to your insurance agent who can shop the plan that has the benefits you would utilize the most. Many of the newer plans have reduced copays and added extra benefits.

Another option that may be important to some is an Advantage PPO. This plan allows beneficiaries to go to doctors outside of the county or state and utilize their nationwide network of doctors. A good plan for those who travel a lot or who winter/summer in different locations. There are lot of options for us who live in Southern California. We live in a very competitive market compared to other less populated areas. We also have larger doctors' networks. Count your blessings.

Last but not least, check your Annual Letter of Change to see if your drug coverage has changed. It can save you considerable dollars to make a change if your drug has been dropped or moved to a higher tier of cost.

GOING SOLAR

Solar energy is growing, and California is leading the way. More and more Californians each year are installing solar panels on their home, businesses, and rental properties, and the energy cost savings can be substantial.

There can also be substantial tax savings as you may get a tax credit of up to 30% of the cost of buying and installing the panels. The credit is reduced to 26% in 2020, 22% in 2021, and then expires after December 31, 2021. Home batteries may also qualify for the solar credit, even if you installed solar panels and claimed a solar credit in the past, but certain requirements must be met.

If you are considering putting solar panels on your property or installing a home battery, beware that there are many aggressive salespeople who are misrepresenting the tax savings that you may be entitled to. Note the following:

Leasing solar panels may be the most economical choice for you; however, tax credits are only available if you purchase the panels;

Roof replacement and repair costs are typically not available for solar credits;

If you finance the purchase of the solar panels through any of the programs that allow you to make your finance payments through your property taxes, that portion of your property taxes is not deductible as property tax;

If you install solar panels on your business or rental property, then you may be required to pay back some or all of the tax credits if you sell the property or convert it to personal use within five years of installing the solar panels; and

If you are an owner of a partnership, LLC, or S corporation that installs solar panels on its property, then you may be able to claim the tax credits on your personal income tax return, but special rules may limit your credit.

There are other tax and nontax considerations regarding whether you should lease or buy your panels or whether you should go with solar at all.

IF YOU NEED HELP

DISPOSAL OF MEDICINES YOU NO LONGER NEED

If your medicine cabinet contains expired prescription medications or any you no longer take, the best way to dispose of them is through the drug take back program. The nearest DEA authorized kiosk is next to the CVS Pharmacy at El Norte which is open 24/7. There is also a kiosk at the Escondido Police Department on Center City Parkway, which is open during regular business hours.


