





## MISCELLANEOUS

### PARKING

(From the CV Rules & Regulations)

1. No vehicle, including recreational vehicles, shall be parked on the street overnight.
2. No vehicle shall be parked on ground cover, gravel or dirt in any area, including private property, except as specifically authorized by management.
3. Vehicles dripping fluid cause damage to parking lots and roadways and shall not be parked in the common area. The owner shall be responsible for any damage to the common area.
4. Residents may park in a guest space when a guest vehicle is parked in the resident's carport, or when their carport is made temporarily inaccessible due to 'work being done in the area'. Under such conditions, the resident shall notify the Village Office as to their parking in the guest space and the estimated duration of such parking.
5. No vehicle shall be parked in a manner which blocks access into any driveway, or in any area, including the street, where the vehicle poses a safety hazard or, in the judgment of the Community Manager, impedes the normal flow of traffic.
6. All vehicles parked in posted areas or spaces shall conform with the requirements posted. Golf carts shall not be parked in lots or spaces reserved for automobiles, and automobiles shall not be parked in lots or spaces reserved for golf carts.
7. Recreational vehicles may not be parked outside a residence except for loading and unloading. Parking for loading or unloading is limited to no more than six (6) hours and not between the hours of 8:00 PM and 8:00 AM, otherwise they may only be parked in the area designated as the RV storage area. RVs parked on the street overnight are subject to towing and a fine.
8. No unusable or unsightly vehicles will be parked in the Village or storage areas.
9. Permanent golf cart parking is limited to a resident's lot and shall be parked only on the paved driveway or the paved area approved by the Architectural & Landscape Committee.
10. No more than 3 (three) street legal motor vehicles will be allowed to park on any unit space without prior recommendation of the A&L Committee and written approval of the Board. (Revised 4-12)

We have until December 7 to make any changes in our Medicare plans. It is still the AEP (Annual Election Period) for those 65 and older.

Coming in January is the Part B premium increase. For those who are just aging in to Medicare in 2016 the new premium will be \$121.80. Those who pay premiums by mail (because they have delayed taking Social Security) will also see the increase. **Those who currently have the part B premium deducted from their Social Security check monthly will still pay \$104.90 with no change.**

If you are struggling with a high cost supplemental plan there are two options to save money. One is to change to an Advantage Plan (replacing original Medicare) or the other is to keep the flexibility of original Medicare by changing to a less expensive Medigap plan like a High deductible F, G, C or N plan.

The high deductible F plan requires you to pay \$2,180 out of pocket each year before you are covered 100% for the rest of the year. The premium is a fraction of the regular F plan and the out of pocket maximum is well below Advantage plans in San Diego. Also more affordable is the G plan which requires one to pay the Part B deductible of \$147 each year then covers 100% of what Medicare do not cover. The N plan is also more affordable but does not cover any excess charges doctors, surgeons, or hospitals may bill over what Medicare allows. One should be aware that if you choose one of the lower coverage Medigap plans, you may not be able to increase to a greater coverage Medigap plan later.

For those under 65, Open Enrollment for individual health insurance doesn't end until January 31. Now is the time to evaluate your best plan for 2016. Enroll by December 15 for a January 1 start date.

The Management depends on the residents to be their eyes and ears. What happens next? The abusing resident will be sent a "Friendly Reminder" letting them know that they are not following the rules and asking them to comply.

If you see the same abuse of the rules after they've been sent the friendly reminder (you can check with the Office to make sure the notice was sent) the next step is to send the Office *another* email stating that you notice the abuse is still happening. The Office will then send a "Notice of Violation".

Nobody wants to be a tattletale, but *somebody* has to make the Management aware or the abuse will continue.


